Item 6: Resilient California Summit

Introduction

The Governor's Office of Land Use and Climate Innovation, Climate Resolve, Farallon Strategies, California Natural Resources Agency, and UC Davis Institute of the Environment will host the Resilient California Summit on October 20 – 22, 2026 at the SAFE Credit Union Convention Center in Sacramento. The Summit will bring together a diverse ecosystem of partners, including but not limited to local and state leaders, Tribal members, experts, artists and community partners from across the state to turn science into action.

The event will highlight major achievements and progress made during the Newsom administration to advance California's climate resilience goals. Key findings from California's Fifth Climate Change Assessment will anchor the event and equip participants with the best available science to inform policy and drive meaningful decisions. Over the course of the Summit, participants will move from understanding the state-of-the science of California's changing climate, to envisioning the future we want to achieve, to identifying the concrete actions needed to make that future a reality. Through a series of interactive sessions, diverse participants will share lessons learned and practical solutions, inspire relevant and timely action, and identify the pathways to a sustainable future.
